The Church's Source of Authority Alternative Standards of Authority

Jesus Christ has been given all authority. However, He speaks to us today through the writings of His holy apostles, who under the guidance of the Holy Spirit faithfully and accurately delivered in the NT Christ's will for the church for all times. Thus, it is through the NT that Christ speaks to and directs the church today. Thus, like those in Jerusalem we must "continue steadfastly in the apostle's doctrine" (Acts 2:42).

The leads to a Dilemma. This truth, as taught in the Bible, often leads to problems in the religious world. There are many that say they fully accept the doctrine of the apostles. However: when confronted with Scripture that challenges a particular belief or practice of theirs they often appeal for authority to a source of authority which says something very much different from that which the apostle's taught. Thus, they show that they only agree with and accept the doctrine of the apostles when it agrees with their own doctrine and that is not how authority in religion is established.

I can honestly say that over the years I have been wrong sometimes in my interpretation of the Bible, but I have never when discovering I was wrong said that I am going to do it anyway and used some source other than the Bible as my reason for doing so. In the lesson this morning we are going to examine some alternative standards of authority, other that the NT, that some resort to in an attempt to defend their religious beliefs and practices. In doing so we shall discover the dangers of these standards and observe how easy it is for us to allow ourselves to be guilty at times of looking to something other than the Bible for the authority behind our own beliefs and practices.

There are basically 2 types of sources that people use for authority today. Objective—where we look outside of ourselves for authority. In things such as my preacher said this or this is what most of the church preferred. Then there is subjective—where we look inside of ourselves for authority. In things such as conscience or our own wisdom and understanding.

But the truth is that it is not in man who walks to direct his own steps. This is why God did not leave us to do so. He instead spoke to us through His Son, who commissioned the apostles to teach His will on earth, and then record it for all times under the guidance of the Holy Spirit who ensured that what we have today in the NT is that which Jesus desired for us to have. Thus, in all matters of faith and practice we must turn to the NT, the final and authoritative word of Jesus the Christ. What do you look to in order to justify your beliefs and practices? Because if it is not the NT, then you are looking to the wrong source.
