The Not-So-Good Preacher

A seminary professor tells the story of one of his first preaching ministries in the city of Los Angeles. Following one sermon, one which the preacher thought went quite well, he stood at the door greeting the people as they left and the remarks concerning his sermon were very complimentary. That is until one kindly older man said, "You preach too long." The professor wasn't particularly fazed by the remark, especially in light of the many positive comments.

Next came the comment, "You did not preach loud enough" and ironically it was from the same man. The professor thought it a bit strange that the same man had come through the line twice, but when the same man came through a third time and said "You used too many big words," he had to find out what was going on.

So the professor went to one of the elders who was standing by and asked him. Do you see that little old man standing over there? Who is he? Don't pay any attention to him the elder replied, all he does is go around and repeat everything he hears. The point was that sometimes people will say nice things to the preacher's face, but say something entirely different to anyone else who listens.

The fact is that preachers are often the punch line of quite a few jokes and you know what I mean. The preacher sure does get paid an awful lot for only working one day a week. When there is something that needs to be done and no one else has the time to do it lets get the preacher to do it, after all he does not have anything else to do during the week etc. etc. In fact I am sure that some of you would love to have had the opportunity to introduce this lesson today entitled the Not So Good Preacher.

However, there are times when a preacher can be very hurt and offended by the comments of those with whom he works. That being primarily, because the jokes are not always told in a humorous manner. The comments about a man's preaching are not always good natured or even helpful. And a lot of times when measuring the value of a preacher we have a tendency to do so based upon the wrong criteria—does he speak well, is he charismatic, is he forceful.

Now I am not saying that these elements are not beneficial for a preacher to possess and in fact they can greatly enhance the message the preacher delivers. In the end though, doesn't it make more sense to evaluate a preacher based upon the faithfulness of the message he preaches than the manner in which he preaches it?

Now let me be clear: I did not begin the sermon this way because I have been hurt or offended by this congregation. I began this way because the text we are going to deal with today touches upon the manner in which people were treating the preaching of the Apostle Paul. Their criticisms were based upon some of the same faulty presumptions about what good preaching is that people today are often guilty of.

In our text today Paul is found talking about his preaching style or according to some the lack thereof. In our text Paul tells why he was, in the eyes of some, a not so good preacher. The fact of the matter is that the Apostle Paul himself would have an extremely difficult time being hired as a minister in one of our churches today. So the purpose of this lesson is to teach us the importance of evaluating a preacher on the content of the message delivered rather than on the style in which it is delivered.
