What It Takes to Be a Great Leader

The Bible is first and foremost about GOD!!! It is a book about what God Has done in the past, about what God is doing in the present and a book about what God is going to do in the future. But even beyond that—it is a book about what God has done in the past, is doing in the present, and will do in the future in the lives of people. It is also about how people responded to what God has done, is doing, and will do. It is a very practical book, because it deals with how God dealt with people, and how people dealt with God.

Therefore it is beneficial for our lives because we can see how God deals with people and thus expect that He will deal with us in similar ways. We get to also see how people responded to God and His Word—so that we can emulate the deeds and dispositions of men and women which pleased God, and we can avoid those which did not.

With this in mind today I want to deliver a character lesson based upon the life of one of the great men in the OT. So that we can "through the patience and comfort of Scriptures have hope" (Rom.15:4), and so that we may learn from those "examples which were written for our admonition, upon whom then end of the ages have come" 1 Cor.10:11. The focal point of this lesson on Bible characters will be, what lessons can we learn from their lives.

Today we will take a look at Joshua and learn what it takes to be a great leader. It is impressive to note the influence that Joshua, the leader of God's people into the Promised Land, had on the People of Israel, during his life and even after he had passed on (Josh.24:15, 29-31). While some of this influence was no doubt due to the fact that God was with Joshua and had done many great works during Joshua's time of leadership. Works like the parting of the Jordan, the collapse of the walls of Jericho, and the standing still of the sun and moon.

However, although God was with Joshua, a lot of the credit for the influence he had among God's people must go to him. For all along God's support of Joshua was based upon Joshua's obedience to the Word of God (Joshua 1:6-9). Joshua was an example of great leadership and shows us an example of what it takes to be a great leader. Every generation of the church is in need of good leadership, especially in times of trouble and distress, and believe me the Church is involved in a time of trouble and distress. A lot of the problem can be traced to the lack of leadership within the church today.

Wendell Winkler said that "the lack of leadership in our churches was the crisis of our generation.". If more churches had solid, faithful, biblically knowledgeable leaders, there would be far less troubles in the church today. Because if we had more leaders in the church today, the moment someone starting causing dissent among the brethren, with their actions or words, the elders of the church would deal with it before it was ever allowed to become a problem.

The problem is that in some churches you have leaders who are no more knowledgeable in the Bible than those they are supposed to be leading, and thus they are "easily tossed to a fro by every new doctrine that come down the road." Thus, the need of men to be great leaders AND to prepare new men to take their place.
