## I Am the Light of the World

John's is the only gospel that records what are known as the "I Am" statements of Jesus. There are seven of these statements in all. In these statements Jesus tells us a lot about Himself and what He has to offer us, blessings that can be found in no one else. We will begin by looking at Jesus' statement in John 8:12. "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life." This statement was made during the Feast of Tabernacles in late October and it was either this feast or Hanukkah in December which served as the backdrop for Jesus' teaching. What can we learn from Jesus' claim to be the "light of the world?"

First we must realize that there is darkness in the world. Darkness is used in the Bible to represent a number of things, but most often it is used to represent moral depravity and sinfulness (Jn.3:19, Rom.13:12-13, Eph.5:11). Thus darkness is used in contrast to light which represents truth, righteousness, and moral purity. We must therefore understand, spiritually speaking, that we are walking in either the darkness or the light, there is no middle ground.

It is unfortunate, but we do live in a world of darkness. Paul describes this group as walking in the futility of their minds, the darkness of their minds, ultimately alienated from God (Eph.4:15-17). If you live in this world you will have to contend with the darkness of it. However, even though we live in a world of darkness, we don't have to be overcome by it because Jesus gives light to the world.

Jesus is the light of the world. Jesus is not a light as though only one way to true understanding and righteousness. He is THE light in that He is the ONLY way to true understanding and righteousness (Jn.14:6). Thus in light of this we must be careful to guard against those who offer us a false light. If one claims to bring the light of Jesus, their deeds will match those prescribed by Jesus and His Apostles.

One may claim to be a servant of the Lord and in fact be a servant of Satan, so be on guard against them (2 Cor.11:13-15). Jesus is the true light of the world and as such the only source of true spiritual life. Jesus offers us an abundant life in the here and now (Jn.10:10), and eternal life in the here after (Jn.17:2). And He offers it to all, as He says He is the light of THE World, not just an elect few.

Jesus is only the light for those who follow Him. While Jesus gives the light of life to all who accept it, He only gives it to those who accept it. Thus, to receive the light of life one must first become a disciple of the Lord's. How? Through faith, confession, repentance, and baptism. However, to continue to receive the light of life one must continue to be a disciple. By continually abiding in His word or teachings (Jn.8:31, 2 Jn.9). You can't be a disciple of the Lord's while living contrary to His teachings.

One of the important things to understand is the fact that as we abide in the word of Jesus—we not only walk in the light—we become a source of light to those living in darkness (Ph.2:14-16). Even though we live in the "midst of a crooked and perverse generation" we must not allow ourselves to be overcome by the darkness. In fact we must overcome the darkness with the light of our lives (Eph.5:8-10).
